AAUW of Kansas, October 2019, Page 2 Support AAUW Fund for a Brighter Future for Women & Girls

If you're new to the AAUW Fund or if you just need to get reacquainted with it, read on to learn more about the need and impact of this valuable source of unrestricted giving.

The AAUW Fund is a general fund for unrestricted gifts, which are used when and where they are most needed. This prevents overfunded and underfunded areas that keep AAUW from reaching our full mission potential. Many people assume that AAUW programs are funded through membership dues and restricted gifts alone, but those only cover a portion of the funds needed to run and grow them.

Funding for all the programs you love come, at least in part, from unrestricted giving. The LAF Fund is almost fully funded because most of its funding comes from restricted giving. Fellowships and grants are the only fully funded program that AAUW has, with endowment funds covering all expenses.

Many sponsors across the country support the National Collegiate Conference for Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) and corporate donations fund about half of our Tech Trek and Tech Savvy STEM programs. The Eleanor Roosevelt Research Fund, Elect Her, Start Smart/Work Smart, and public policy – which receives the least amount of restricted funding among these examples - rely on unrestricted giving to fully fund them. Relying on unrestricted giving to fund these programs depletes the pool of unrestricted gifts and every year there are less resources available. In time, this will start to affect how AAUW funds these programs and projects.

We don't know what challenges women will face in the future, but we do know that AAUW has always been there to meet them. By making an unrestricted gift, you are supporting all of AAUW for the future.
