As a new member of the state board, I was very surprised to learn



that Kansas has more national AAUW members (people who are not branchaffiliated) than members in our five branches. There are about 160 national members in Kansas who do not have a home branch. I imagine this is at least in part due to geographical barriers (no branches in the western two-thirds of the state).

The challenges of the pandemic have also brought an opportunity to use technology to stay connected. Geography no longer stands in the way of members from across the state joining together in virtual experiences, whether that be monthly branch meetings, book clubs, or statewide town hall gatherings. There is even potential for new virtual branches to form and meet regularly.

One of the best ways for us to stay better connected as a state community is to keep our contact information current (especially email addresses). AAUW just completed a major infrastructure change to make this easier and more user-friendly. They have created a Community Hub (aauw.org/membership/) where each member can log in and update their information. Many of you probably received an email about this. I encourage you to utilize this new feature so that we can continue to foster greater connections and energy toward AAUW's valuable mission.

let us know by April 15 that you will present this recognition of your branch.


